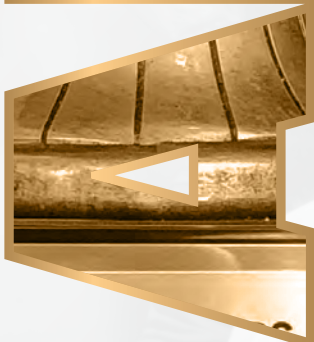

Look Back In Time



Coast Soccer League (CSL) is the oldest and most successful competitive soccer league in Southern California. All of today's successful clubs got their start in CSL, and more National Champions have been won by CSL teams than any other league in the nation. So, there is a rich history of success that got it beginning more than fifty years ago.

The inaugural meeting of Coast Soccer League was held in early 1968, the league started with just 30 teams from 10 clubs. By the mid- 1970's the league was rapidly expanding as the marriage of both the recreational and competitive philosophies emerged and successful recreational leagues such as (Orange Junior SC, Fullerton Rangers etc.) created teams from the best recreational players.

CSL grew to become the preeminent competitive league in Southern California, and during the 1990's the League was run by Gary Sparks who created the CSL Premier division for the top teams. Gary oversaw a period of tremendous growth that was sparked off in part by the World Cup being held in the US in 1994. In 2001 Karen Sparks – no relation to Gary – took over as Exec Director, and Karen has worked tirelessly ever since for the betterment of the game, the teams, the league, and most important to Karen, the kids

Today CSL serves teams from all over Southern California ensuring that competitive teams have a home where the play level is determined by performance on the field, and schedules, referees and fields are organized for the players to enjoy a safe, enjoyable soccer environment.

“Each of the Coast Soccer League participating clubs operates independently of the gaming circuit. It is independent about recruiting, membership fees, coaching philosophy, club organization, fund-raising, and home field site.

The League operates for the purpose of preparing game schedules, assigning referees, and ensuring that clubs maintain the safe conduct of the games, players, spectators, and administrators”

New Season, Exciting Opportunities

The fall season is now underway, but there are many exciting playing opportunities still open to all CSL teams. These initiatives and programs help teams maximize the enjoyment of the season and creates a platform for success.

League Cup

This competition runs concurrently with the fall season. The League Cup offers teams additional games, and the opportunity to play against both different opponents, and opponents from a higher playing bracket. Applications for League Cup are now open.

Olympic Development Program

All CSL teams can nominate players to participate in the Olympic Development Program. CSL is working with Cal South to coordinate the league schedule to ensure all players who wish to try out to be part of this elite playing opportunity, will be available to participate in the exclusive CSL ODP training centers.

Year Round or Seasonal Play

Regardless of the CSL bracket you play in; we offer the playing opportunity that is right for you. Teams can sign up for either a Year-Round playing schedule, or Seasonal play. At the younger age brackets the opportunity to play in CSL in the fall, State Cup early in the new year, and then CSL spring, starting in March, creates a year-round playing schedule. For the older age brackets, the combination of CSL fall, the California Regional League (CRL), and State and National Cup, offers a continuous year-round playing opportunity*.

*The schedule for older teams breaks to accommodate High school play.

CRL games will be scheduled to align with the conclusion of the CSL fall season, and all games will be scheduled to align with the State Cup and National Cup schedule for all teams. This alignment of playing opportunities gives clubs a year-round playing schedule with a seamless transition from the fall season to winter/spring league play, into the season ending State and National championships.

For teams that wish to take a break, or allow players to participate in other sports, CSL offers seasonal playing opportunities during both the fall and spring season.

This seamless approach to scheduling, and the opportunity to play against competition at the elite level, gives clubs the platform to provide players with the right playing opportunity, regardless of the level of play.

Finally responding to market feedback, CSL now offers both a Select League and a Juniors League. These two leagues, offer a competitive soccer experience for teams who are not yet ready for the greater commitment required to play in CSL's traditional competitive leagues.

This broad range of playing opportunities ensures that teams at every level, can find the playing opportunity that is right for them. Enjoy your season and continue to create family memories that will last a lifetime.
